Stronger, Safer Self-Advocates (Group Training)

Presented in a fun, interactive style, this training provides critical safety, prevention, and preparedness education for consumers in a group

setting, community, workplace and school safety emphasized.

Healthy Relationships (Group Training)

Designed to provide persons with developmental disabilities with the skills needed to create healthy relationships and safe sexual attitudes, as well as accessing health care.
